MARSHALS SERVICE JAIL CONTRACT, Continued from April 2

Sheriff George Oppedyk, Deputy Sheriffs Gary Taylor and Chad Kingsland, Clerk/Auditor/Recorder Michelle Emerson, and Deputy Elections Clerk Cy Lootens were present.

Sheriff Oppedyk presented three original copies of an Intergovernmental Agreement for detention services with the United States Marshals Service, which had been revised following the Board's discussion on April 2.

❖ A Motion was made by Commissioner Howell to authorize the chairman to sign the contract with the Marshals Service as corrected. It was seconded, followed by discussion, and carried with unanimous ayes.

GEORGE OPPEDYK—SHERIFF MATTERS

Sheriff George Oppedyk, Deputy Sheriffs Gary Taylor and Chad Kingsland, Clerk/Auditor/Recorder Michelle Emerson, and Deputy Elections Clerk Cy Lootens were present.

Vehicle Purchase: Sheriff Oppedyk requested to purchase a vehicle from the City of Jerome. He explained that his department had purchased a new police dog (at no expense to the County) and said that he believed it would be better to purchase the vehicle with a canine cage than to transfer the County's current cage to a different vehicle. He added that the new vehicle was equipped with law enforcement equipment but was selling for just the price of a car and that the sheriff's vehicle budget could cover the price of the vehicle.

❖ A Motion was made by Commissioner Morley to allow the sheriff's department to buy a 2015 Ford Explorer Police Interceptor, totally equipped for a canine officer and sheriff duties, for \$23,808. It was seconded and carried with unanimous ayes.

Trade-in of Old Police Vehicles: Sheriff Oppedyk asked to dispose of sheriff vehicles no longer useable.

❖ A Motion was made by Commissioner Howell to authorize the sheriff's department to dispose of excess vehicles no longer useable with Goode Motors in Burley as trade-ins for new vehicles, up to ten vehicles. It was seconded and carried with unanimous ayes.

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Impound Yard: The Sheriff discussed with the Board ridding the vehicles from the impound yard at the Jerome Airport. Deputy Kingsland said the sheriff's department had requested that the City of Jerome remove its vehicles from the yard within the next few weeks. The Sheriff said the vehicles that were not for trade-in would be sold at auction.

Sheriff Oppedyk said he needed to prepare the new impound yard at the sheriff's complex to house vehicles.

➤ It was determined the sheriff would consult an architect if necessary and obtain some bids for gravel.

Pod Location: The Board discussed locating the County's pod currently in Twin Falls.

➤ It was determined to find the cost of a base for the pod and to have another discussion on the fate of the pod.

Emerson requested that the Board amend the agenda to adopt polling places so she could submit them to the local newspaper.

❖ A Motion was made by Commissioner Morley to amend the agenda to add Michelle Emerson to verify the polling places with the Commissioners. It was seconded and carried with unanimous ayes.

MICHELLE EMERSON—DESIGNATE POLLING PLACES

Emerson and Lootens presented the polling places for the May 15 Primary Election. Emerson said she would like to announce the election with a reader board purchased by the County, and it was determined she would consult the maintenance supervisor about pouring a concrete pad for the board.

❖ A Motion was made by Commissioner Morley accept Resolution 2018-10, designated polling places. It was seconded and carried with unanimous ayes.
